



Diploma Supplement

This Diploma Supplement follows the model developed by the European Commission, the Council of Europe and the UNESCO/CEPES. The supplement provides sufficient independent data to improve the international transparency and fair academic and professional recognition of qualifications. It is designed to provide a description of the nature, level, context, content and status of the studies that were pursued and successfully completed by the individual named on the original qualification to which this supplement is appended. It should be free from any value judgements, equivalence statements or suggestions about recognition. Information in all eight sections should be provided. - 4.4 Grading scale: Academic work is graded with pass/fail or a numeric grade. The grading scale ranges from 6 to 1; 4 is the minimum pass mark. Grades are either whole numbers or half numbers.
Grade averages are rounded to one decimal place. Half tenths are rounded up. The Latin grade is determined on the basis of the grade average derived from the course assessment and master's thesis grades rounded to one decimal place.
- 4.5 Latin grades are awarded by the following grade key: 5.6 to 6.0 summa cum laude; 5.2 to 5.5 magna cum laude; 4.8 to 5.1 cum laude; 4.4 to 4.7 bene; 4.0 to 4.3 rite; below 4.0 fail.
- 4.6 Overall classification of the qualification: please refer to the degree transcript

5. Information on the function of the qualification

- 5.1 Access to further studies: access to doctoral programs at the Faculty of Law, University of Basel with a master's grade of at least 5.0. The Doctoral Board may approve admission for candidates with a grade of 4.8 (cum laude) on individual application.
- 5.2 Authorization to exercise a regulated profession: not eligible
